A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MISS TAMMIE



I hope everyone had a wonderful 3 day weekend and a fun Halloween!

In class we used pumpkins to work through the scientific process looking to answer the question: What attributes of the pumpkin, if any, affect the number of seeds inside. The students took the weight, height, and circumference of their pumpkin, then counted the seeds. Our data was inconclusive, we could not find any strong correlations.

We saved the pumpkin seeds and used Sugar Pumpkins to explore making Pumpkin pie and roasting pumpkin seeds to enjoy the snacks of fall.
